



EMT USA, LLC expands into Alabama

Clayton, MO July 1, 2009 – EMT USA, the Nation's first and only seller of non-emergency medical transportation franchises, expands into Alabama in a move that grants EMT one of only two companies to have state-wide operating authority.

EMT USA's Tampa Bay, Florida based EMT franchise, owned and operated by David and Jeanine Blake, partnered with a group of investors to purchase Fresh Air of Alabama.

The investment group will convert Fresh Air of Alabama to an EMT franchise and immediately start offering services in both the Birmingham and Montgomery areas, with plans to open in Mobile by the end of the year.

"This was a great addition to EMT USA's already growing list of franchises. Alabama is a rapidly growing market, and we are extremely happy to be able to provide our services to the residents of this state," commented Bernie Squitieri, President of EMT USA.

Express Medical Transporters pioneered the non-emergency medical transportation business. Formed in 1996 in St. Louis, MO by Bernie Squitieri, EMT quickly became Missouri's largest for-profit provider of non-emergency medical transportation services.

In 2007 Squitieri took his proven EMT model national by forming EMT USA. In 2009, EMT USA sold franchises in Tennessee, Wisconsin, Missouri and New Mexico. Currently, EMT franchises operate in 10 states across the country.
